Opportunity


Northwell Health aimed to transform the historic O'Toole Building in Greenwich Village into a state-of-the-art medical facility, offering emergency room, imaging, and ambulatory services to the local community. Originally designed by Albert Ledner as the National Maritime Union headquarters, the building required a renovation that respected its historical significance while upgrading it to meet modern medical needs. One of the key features was restoring the building's glass block façade, which wrapped around the entire structure. This was an essential design element to preserve the building's unique look, while also ensuring compliance with modern safety standards and performance requirements.

Solution

GBA Architectural Products worked with the project's construction team, including Turner Construction Company and Perkins Eastman, to restore and modify the glass block façade. GBA supplied 12" x 12" x 4" and 8" x 8" x 4" Clarity glass blocks with a fibrous insert to filter light and create the desired opacity. In collaboration with the other contractors, GBA ensured the glass blocks were properly installed with updated steel framing and other components to enhance the durability and performance of the façade. Detailed shop drawings and careful execution allowed the project to be completed smoothly and on time.

The light-transmitting properties of the glass create a visually appealing effect, while the updated structural elements ensure the façade's longevity.
