## Opportunity

The Youngstown Historical Center of Industry and Labor, a monument to the steel industry and its workers, faced the challenge of maintaining its architectural integrity while ensuring the long-term durability of its glass block system. The back entrance of the building, constructed using Decora glass blocks set in steel framing, had suffered wear and tear over the years. The Ohio Historical Society sought a solution to preserve the structure's historical character while ensuring the glass block system would remain functional for at least another 30 years, maintaining the building's connection to the region's industrial past. The project also aimed to update the aging structure with modern materials and techniques while preserving the authenticity of its original design.

### Solution

GBA Architectural Products was called upon to restore the glass block system. After an on-site consultation with lead architect Meta Von Rabenau, a plan was devised to replace any damaged blocks and upgrade the mortar and sealant components. GBA procured the same Pittsburgh Corning Decora glass blocks to maintain consistency and restore the structure to its original condition. Additionally, the steel framing was treated, primed, and painted to replicate the look of the building from its opening day, and new, modern sealants were applied to prevent moisture penetration, ensuring the system's longevity.
